Event Blurb (Agency FB/Bold; Purple)

You can place the event description here, or wherever you would like it to be. Try to experiment with different fonts and colors.

Put the most important information about your event in the center of your flyer. That is where most people will be looking. Again, you can experiment with fonts, sizes, and colors. You can also use background colors like the example above.

Add Speaker Picture

It is important that you add a picture of your speaker on your flyer. You can download pictures of our speakers from the IHC website, or you can contact the Speakers Bureau Coordinator by email to request a photo.
